



## How to Wash Competition Terms & Conditions



1. The How To Wash Competition is only open to schools with children up to the age of 7. Private individuals must approach their school if they wish to participate.
2. The How To Wash Competition is organised by the Bathroom Manufacturers Association of Federation House, Station Road, Stoke on Trent, ST4 2RT in conjunction with a chosen partner, which will vary according to geographical location and Competition type.
3. For the purposes of this Competition the South East is defined as: Bedfordshire, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Cambridgeshire, Dorset, Essex, Hampshire, Hertfordshire, Kent, London, Middlesex, Norfolk, North Somerset, Oxfordshire, Suffolk, Surrey, Sussex and Wiltshire.
4. The Competition will be rolled out in the South East – as defined in clause 3 - initially, and then to other regions on a date to be confirmed by the Bathroom Manufacturers Association (BMA). If you are outside the South East and want your class to enter please contact the BMA directly to receive a date for entry deadlines in your area.
5. Entrants must provide the following details of their school and teacher when entering the competition: name, all contact details, class number, number of pupils in the class, age of pupils, any special requirements.
6. The competition is open to schools in the South East of England only in the first instance.
7. All entries must be submitted by post to: How To Wash Competition, Bathroom Manufacturers Association, Federation House, Station Road, Stoke on Trent, ST4 2RT.
8. Entries must be received by 20 January 2008.
9. Judging will take place by representatives of the BMA and the judges' decision is final.
10. The winning class will be notified by post.
11. The BMA does not accept responsibility for late or lost entries.
12. The BMA reserves the right to cancel or amend the competition at any time, if deemed necessary due to circumstances beyond its control.
13. The prize is non-transferable and no cash alternative is available. The BMA reserves the right to substitute prizes at any time.
14. The prize will be offered in conjunction with Three Valleys Water for the South East and other utility companies in other areas thereafter.
15. As part of the prize, the winning class will receive return transport in accordance with the guidelines from by the Department for Children, Schools & Families to the selected venue, lunch for all attendees and a 'goodie bag' where possible.

16. The winning class/school will be solely responsible for any damage, loss, or injury incurred by any teacher or child who attends the prize/trip.
17. The prize must be taken in accordance with the timescales and dates stipulated by the BMA and Three Valleys Water for the South East.
18. Competition organisers reserve the right to reproduce press releases and photographs of the competition entries and the trip, in accordance with parental and the school's consent.
